



Huckabee Said No Matter What Supreme Court Decides, "I May Be Lonely, I May Be The Only One, But I'm Going To Stand Absolutely Faithful To The Issue Of Marriage." According to Talking Points Memo, in an interview with Hugh Hewitt: "And no matter what the Supreme Court decides, Huckabee said he'll always stand for 'biblical' marriage. 'I may be lonely, I may be the only one, but I'm going to stand absolutely faithful to the issue of marriage not because it's a politically expedient thing to do, because it isn't. Huckabee Said Supreme Court Decision Won't Make Marriage Equality The Law Of The Land Because The Legislature Would Still Have To Enact Legislation. According to Talking Points Memo: "Former Arkansas governor and potential Republican presidential candidate Mike Huckabee on Tuesday said that if the Supreme Court rules in favor of same-sex marriage, states don't necessarily need to begin issuing marriage licenses to gay couples. Huckabee told conservative radio host Hugh Hewitt that he was "angry" with the "notion of judicial supremacy.' If the courts make a decision, I hear governors and even some aspirants to the presidency say well, that's settled, and it's the law of the land,' he said. 'No, it isn't the law of the land. Constitutionally, the courts cannot make a law. They can interpret one. And then the legislature has to create enabling legislation, and the executive has to sign it, and has to enforce it.' According to Huckabee, the legislative branch would need to draw up legislation to legalize same-sex marriage. 'This idea that a judge makes a ruling on Friday afternoon, and Saturday morning same-sex marriage licenses are being given out, that's utter nonsense, because there's not been any agreement with the other two branches of government,' he said." Huckabee Said If Court Rules In Favor Of Same-Sex Marriage, "Who's To Stop" A Person From Saying 'Well, I'd Like To Marry Two Women, Or I'd Like To Marry Two Men For A Woman"? According to Talking Points Memo, in a radio interview with conservative radio host Hugh Hewitt: "The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to decide whether state bans on same-sex marriage violate equal protection guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment. If the court rules that the state bans are unconstitutional, states would no longer be able to keep clerks from issuing marriage licenses to gay couples. However, Huckabee said he was worried such a ruling would lead to polygamy. 'I think there's going to be immediate cases filed where a person will say, 'Well, I'd like to marry two women, or

The Knapps say they'll shut down their business first. The Alliance Defending Freedom has filed a federal lawsuit on their behalf. The city claims they don't deserve a religious exemption because they're a for-profit business. Here's my question: how many pastors accept payment for performing weddings? Huckabee Compared LGBT Marriage Equality To Incest, Polygamy, and Drug Use And Said LGBT Couples Should Not Be Allowed To Adopt Because "Children Aren't Puppies". According to the Associated Press: "Mike Huckabee, a possible Republican presidential candidate in 2012, says the effort to allow gays and lesbians to marry is comparable to legalizing incest, polygamy and drug use. Huckabee also told college journalists last week that gay couples should not be permitted to adopt. 'Children are not puppies,' he said. Huckabee visited The College of New Jersey in Ewing, N.J., last Wednesday to speak to the Student Government Association. He also was interviewed by a campus news magazine, The Perspective, which published an article on Friday. Huckabee told the interviewer that not every group's interests deserve to be accommodated, if their lifestyle is outside of what he called 'the ideal.' 'That would be like saying, well there's there are a lot of people who like to use drugs so let's go ahead and accommodate those who want to use drugs. There are some people who believe in incest, so we should accommodate them. In an interview with Rosie O'Donnell, Huckabee said, "The point that I have tried to make is, I think the ideal is traditional marriage. Man, woman raising children that they've created and we don't always have the ideal [...] HUCKABEE: I certainly believe adoption ought to be a high priority and as a person who is pro-life, I certainly think we need to make a greater effort to put children with families who are going to nurture them and care for them.' O'DONNELL: 'And does that preclude gay families in your mind?' HUCKABEE: 'Well, you know Rosie, again, I think people have to make their own decision about what a family ought to look like and I'm not going to judge you or judge anybody else because I know there are so many loving people who are in same-sex relationships and they have adopted children and they love those kids. I'm not going to judge them. I'm simply not going there:" [Think Progress, 4/23/2010, AUDIO]

Huckabee Supports Reinstating Don't Ask, Don't Tell, And Believes Troops Do, Too. According to Talking Points Memo: "In an interview with One News Now, former Gov. Mike Huckabee (R-AR) said that he supports reinstating 'Don't Ask, Don't Tell' -- legislation repealed by Congress in December, which prohibited gay men and women from serving openly in the military. In the interview, Huckabee said he believes the troops want the ban reinstated. 'There's been some talk that the military is fine with having same-sex orientation people,' he said. 'But if you really surveyed the

combat troops, that is not at all the case.' Huckabee also criticized politicians for getting involved in an issue he views as the military's terrain. 'I don't think that these are decisions that politicians should make,' he said. 'These are decisions that soldiers should make. When the soldiers in the foxholes make the decisions, they choose something different -- and we should listen to them.'" [Talking Points Memo, 3/23/2011]

Huckabee Said He Would Let The Military Decide Whether To Overturn 'Don't Ask, Don't Tell: In an interview with Larry King, Huckabee was asked if he would keep 'Don't Ask, Don't Tell. One thing I don't think you need is a president who's trying to tell the military how to run the military, other than set broad policy agenda.
